Rosemary Wakeman is the author of *Practicing Utopia: An Intellectual History of the New Town Movement* (University of Chicago Press, 2016) as well as *The Heroic City: Paris 1945-1958* (University of Chicago Press, 2009) and *Modernizing the Provincial City: Toulouse 1945-1975* (Harvard University Press, 1998). She is also editor of *Themes in Modern European History, 1945 to the Present* (Routledge, 2003). Wakeman has published numerous articles on urban history and on cities including most recently "Rethinking Postwar Planning History" in *Planning Perspectives*29(2014) and "Was there an Ideal Socialist City? Socialist New Town as Modern Dreamscapes" in *Transnationalism and the German City* (Palgrave Macmillan, 2014). Her current book project is An Urban History of Modern Europe: 1815 to the Present to be published by Bloomsbury Press.
