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COURSE OVERVIEW

This course begins with a brief discussion of the differences between generative linguistics and sociolinguistics. After a review of data gathering and fieldwork methods, several English variables will be discussed in some detail, including a few on-going changes in English. Further topics include American English–Hungarian language contact, the spread of English globally, and Linguistic Human Rights.
