

English Linguistics - MA

The MA in Linguistics constitutes a distinct program within the MA in English Studies Program at the Institute of English and American Studies.

DEL's program offers a variety of introductory and advanced courses in linguistics, covering theoretical areas such as syntax and semantics as well as more applied areas such as sociolinguistics and second language acquisition.

As a student of our program, you will be encouraged to find topics for individual research projects and get involved in our talent management programs and the active academic and social life of our department.

Our program can also prepare you for further graduate studies in our PhD Program in English Linguistics.

- **Foundational (compulsory) courses of the MA program:** The English language, Modern British society and language, Terms and concepts in literary and linguistic studies, Advanced academic writing, Trends in linguistic, literary and cultural studies, Historical aspects of English linguistics, culture and literature, Advanced research methods.

- **Some elective courses** (12 are needed, the courses on offer vary each year depending on student interest and our faculty's teaching schedules): Syntax, Language acquisition, The social and discourse aspects of language, Empirical linguistics, Computational linguistics, Issues in biolinguistics, psycholinguistics and neurolinguistics, Perspectives on the lexicon, Argument structure, Current issues in language studies, etc.



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
